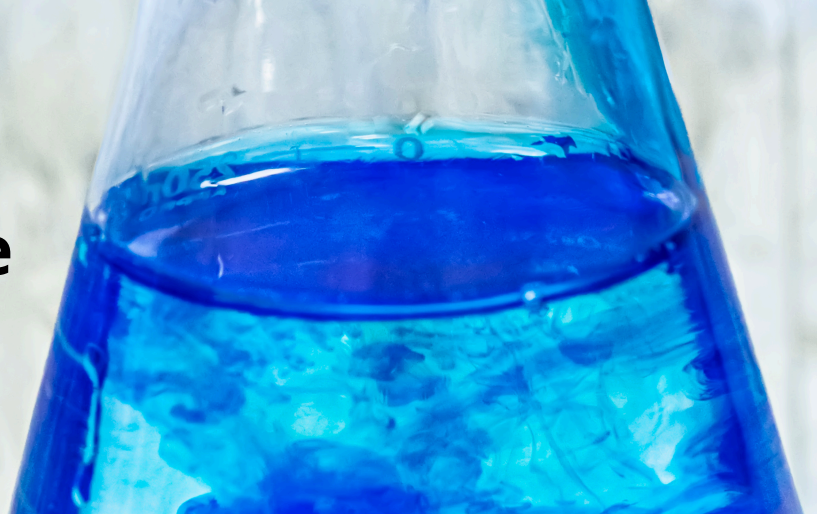

Methylene Chloride Compliance Checklist

1

Identify Applicability

- Confirm if your organization manufactures, processes, distributes, uses, or disposes of methylene chloride or related products.

2

Workplace Chemical Protection Program (WCPP)

- Develop a WCPP for continued use of methylene chloride under regulated conditions.
- Ensure compliance with the exposure limit of 2 ppm (8-hour TWA) and 16 ppm (15-min TWA).

3

Initial Monitoring and Exposure Control

- Conduct initial exposure monitoring.
- Establish regulated areas within 3 months of initial monitoring data.
- Provide respiratory and dermal protection within specified timelines.

4

Exposure Control Plan

- Develop and implement an exposure control plan by the required deadlines.
- Notify affected workers within 30 days of plan completion.

5

Periodic and As-Needed Monitoring

- Schedule periodic monitoring every 5 years or as frequent as every 3 months.
- Conduct additional monitoring after any changes in exposure conditions.

6

Prohibition Compliance

- Prohibit distribution for consumer use by May 5, 2025.
- Cease most commercial uses by April 28, 2026.
- Ensure specific furniture refinishing uses comply until May 8, 2029.

7

Safety Data Sheets (SDS)

- Update SDS by October 7, 2024 (manufacturers) or December 4, 2024 (processors/distributors).
- Notify downstream users with updated SDS.

8

Recordkeeping

- Maintain records of monitoring, exposure plans, and worker notifications.
- Respond to worker record requests within 15 days.

This checklist ensures alignment with the TSCA rule requirements and supports compliance efforts.
